Historical Audiovisuals Duplication: Vendor Information

Films and videos from the National Library of Medicine's (NLM) Historical Audiovisuals Collection may be duplicated if they are determined to be in the public domain, if proof of permission from the copyright holder has been received by NLM, or if proof of due diligence to determine copyright and locate the rights-holder is provided.

Before any film or video can be copied, the User Agreement (one per title) and the Restriction Notice (one completed notice with list of titles attached) must be completed and returned to us. The forms may be mailed, scanned/e-mailed, or faxed.

Many professional post-production houses will be able to digitize your film or tape while handling it safely. NLM provides a partial list of active U.S. vendors, but does not endorse a particular one. Vendors include:
