

Teacher's Anticipation/Reaction Worksheet

Topic: 向非典宣战 (“Declare a War Against the SARS” poster)

Instructions:

1. Look at the poster for one minute, then record your true-or-false answer under “Before Reading” (left columns) for each of five statements listed in the middle column. You don’t have to understand every Chinese text on the poster. Come up with your answer based on common sense, what you already know about China, and the visual clues of the poster.
2. Take a closer look at the poster with the five statements in mind. Afterwards, record your true-or-false answers under “After Reading” (right columns). Be prepared to explain why you have or have not changed your answer after a close examination of the poster.
