Dear Dr. Adams:

In accordance with our recent discussion, the time is now fast approaching when we must put together a five year report of the accomplishments of the Medical Counseling Clinics. From our talk I assume that this material is readily available, with reference to the Provident Clinic, and can be adapted to fit into a composite report of the entire narcotic's program, including the activities of the three clinics and the jail project.

While we do not know too much about the work at the Bridewell Jail we would like for you to set that up as a separate report to be discussed in conjunction with the project at the County Jail.

As I had mentioned to you before, it is the desire of the Springfield office that this should be a fairly comprehensive report of the five year study which will be printed and bound in a more permanent fashion than previous reports. Please refer particularly to the mimeographed report of 1953. This seems to be essentially the logical format to follow. The same requests are being made of the Northwestern and County Jail groups as well as the old staff of the Illinois Clinic.

Please feel free to offer any suggestions you may have as we would like to have all the information from the clinics ready to put together by the end of May. The Clinic heads will be asked to confer on the composition of the first part of the work which will be a composite statement. This will be followed as in 1953 with a more detailed statistical and essay description of the individual clinic activities.
