Berry for his outstanding service as a member of the first National Advisory Council on Regional Medical Programs. With his Council colleagues during his two-year term, he played a key role in the formulation of policies and plans for implementing Public Law 89-239 and the definition of the intent and purposes of that Law. As a result, some 51 Regional Medical Programs began their planning phase and 5 of these became operational during this period.
