

'Wouldn't take nothin' for journey, says Dr. L.H. Berry in new book

Dr. Leonidas H. Berry, a well-known specialist in digestive diseases and organizer of voluntary programs for the improvement of community health, has announced the publication and release of his latest book, "Wouldn't Take Nothin' For My Journey."

Dr. Berry has worked with the African Methodist Episcopal Church as Medical Director of its Health Commission for many years. His current book, which was just released by Johnson Publishing Company, publishers of Ebony, and Jet magazines, is essentially a geneological story of his family, going back 200 years. The book emphasizes the impact

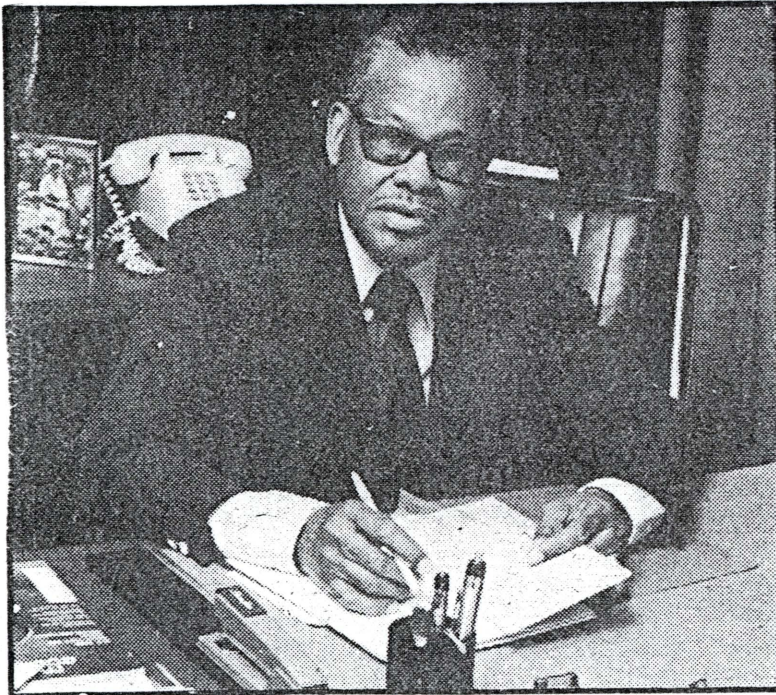
of the Black Church, and especially the A.M.E. Church, in the cultural growth and development of Black families.

The book will be reviewed at an Autograph Party to be held at the Woodlawn AME Church, 6456 S. Evans Ave., at 1 p.m. on Sunday, August 23. The reviewer will be Dr. Larry Murphy, an AME minister and professor in the Northwestern University Divinity School.

Dr. Berry will make remarks on his research and the history of his writings and autograph copies of the book, which will be available for purchase at a cost of \$14.95. The book is a hard-back edition of 436 pages, including 56

pages of photographs.
