Dear Dick,

I did not pursue further the possibility of joining your group for the Japan Congress because my plans could not be fitted into your schedule. I am flying from Chicago on September 13, arriving in Tokyo on the 14th, stopping at the Tokyo-Hilton Hotel for the Congress. I will leave Tokyo September 26, spending three days in Seoul, Korea, to the 29th, then three days in Hong Kong to October 3, and four days in the Philippines to October 7, returning to Hawaii on October 7 (going I will fly via Anchorage). I will remain in Honolulu for seven days, to October 14.

I will carry my gastroscope and arrangements are being made for lecture-demonstrations in some of the places. I will have an exhibit at the Congress. I would be interested in a lecture-demonstration or showing a movie at the University of Hawaii or one of the teaching hospitals connected therewith during my stay on the Islands October 7-14, if you feel that this is feasible. As I think I told you, three Hawaiian doctors have taken my courses in gastroscopy through the years. They are Dr. Bergin, Dr. Okazaki, and Dr. Hayshi.

I am also a member of the National Advisory Council on regional medical programs against heart disease, cancer, and stroke. Our Council just awarded a grant to the University of Hawaii to conduct a planning study under Dr. Windsor C. Cutting. I think they had a very interesting proposal and it would be interesting while there to see how there program is moving along.
