Dear Mr. Hastings:

I have talked with your Chicago representatives about the possibility that your company might be interested in financing the production of an intragastric movie through the gastroscope showing the various lesions such as ulcer for our graduate teaching purposes. I have been teaching gastroenterology and gastroscopy at the Cook County Graduate School and the County Hospital for more than 20 years. I now have graduate students in all of the continents of the world and many in the United States. Most of these men are associated with medical schools and teaching hospitals. In fact, with some pardonable pride, I think that it is generally recognized that we have probably trained more graduate students in gastroscopy than anyone else. This movie would be a sound coordinated 16 mm. color production to be used in our classes and shown at medical meetings in the U. S. A. and abroad. Copies, of course, could be made for distribution elsewhere. We need such a reproduction in the near future to replace an outmoded amateur film. Photographs ~~adherent in~~ *showing* gelatin to the gastric mucosa could be included.
