Dr. Elmer Clayton Terry holds a place of distinction in the memory of the students of Howard University and the Internes of Freedmen's Hospital who were privileged to study the theory and to practice the art of medicine under his guidance.

The contributions which Dr. Terry made to Clinical Medicine at Howard University and Freedmen's Hospital are of far greater significance than is generally recognized:

- In his early years, he organized and placed the instruction in Physical Diagnosis on a sound basis at Howard University and Freedmen's Hospital, continuing its emphasis throughout his 24 years of service.
- Dr. Terry considered the practice of Internal Medicine always serious business, demanding the highest in intellectual effort, industry and intuitive judgement. This point of view he endeavored to pass on to all of his students.
- 3. His love for the field of Internal Medicine and his devotion to his students led him beyond the call of duty. He arranged extracurricular quiz sessions for the students; he was always available and at times the only one available to assist the internes and students on difficult cases regardless as to whether the call came during the day or at night.
- 4. His excellence as a diagnostician at the bedside especially of the heart and lungs, his enthusiasm for Internal Medicine, his demonstration that sound Internal Medicine is of basic importance to surgery and the other specialties, all made him prominent as a pioneer in Internal Medicine at Howard University and Freedmen's Hospital. His skill, his knowledge, his sincerity, and his dramatic teaching techniques encouraged many of his students to choose Internal Medicine as their field of specialization.
- 5. Dr. Terry's creative energy was expressed not only in the practice and teaching of Internal Medicine, but he also made genuine contributions as an organizer among professional men.
 - (a) It was his vision and energetic leadership which led to the organization of this, the Association of Former Internes and Residents of Freedmen's Hospital.
 - (b) In advance of many others, he saw clearly the interrelationship of Dentistry, Pharmacy and Medicine, and was one of the founders of Chi Delta Mu Society which aided in bringing these three professional groups together for the better understanding of their common problems.

Because of what he was and what he is, Dr. Elmer Clayton Terry has earned more than a cherished place in our memory; he has earned the gratitude of all whom he touched personally, and the gratitude of all who, through us, will become his beneficiaries.

We salute E. C. Terry for his many achievements and significant contributions to the practice of Clinical Medicine and to Medical Education.
