Dr. Aric Oldberg before the City Council Counittee on Health, upon his appointment as Precident of the Board of Health.

Since there was so stemographer present, the following is necessarily my best recollection of Dr. Oldberg's testimony this morning on the subject of hospital discrimination against qualified Magro physicians:

"I do not think that hospital bias against staff appointments for Magro physicians comes within the purview of the Scalth Department. I do not think that I should be a torchbearer for this, or that it is part of what I would have to do as Fresident of the Board of Scalth.

"I certainly understand the problem. I am vice-president of a group which has been trying to expend medical opportunities for Regross, starting with the medical schools, the intermedips, the recidencies, and the patients in the hospitals. I think that it is a difficult thing to go to these hospitals, which are private institutions where the doctors get together and vote on staff appointments, and say to them that they have to take on a Regro physician because he is a Regro.

"You are talking to someone who knows a good deal about these problems and has done a good deal. I do not have to defend my position. I have talked at length to physicians about this problem and I have not seen any evidence of bias.

"This is something that has to be done in a quiet way. I am familiar with Dr. McLean's speech before the Institute of Medicine and his position, and I do not agree entirely on the way to handle the situation. Dr. Stapto, sitting next to me, can testify to my position and my fuelings. I do not heed to defend my position.

"I believe in working on a problem of this kind quietly and out of the limelight. I do not care what the city douncil said in a resolution it passed three years ago. Perhaps I ought not to say this. I do not think that I should enter on the duties of Fresident of the Board of Sealth under the handions of having to proceed first of all on a problem of this kind.

"I am a vice-president of the group Dr. McLean beads - a national foundation for medical education for Regross - and we have worked on this problem for many years. I do not need to defend my position.

"It is my opinion that this problem of hospital staff appointment is not one of the pressing problems of the hoard of Health, nor one of the minor problems, at least not for the present."
