Dear Doctor Berry:

Our project "Survey of the Factors Contributing to Drug Addiction in British Columbia" will be completed by March of this year.

The study is sponsored by the University of British Columbia through Federal Government Grants. The research team consists of Dr. G.H. Stevenson, Director, Mr. Lingley, Psychologist and myself as Psychiatric Social Worker. You will, no doubt, recall meeting Dr. Stevenson, during his tour of the various institutions and clinics in connection with Drug Addiction in the United States.

Though our study is largely of exploratory nature, it is most interesting and challenging. I am most desirous of continuing my studies in the field of drug addiction relative to the more specific aspects - socio-economic and cultural, treatment and rehabilitation, but it may take some time before provisions for such studies are forthcoming in Canada.

A great deal of work has been undertaken by your clinics and hospitals in the field of drug addiction and I would be most interested to know what employment opportunities exist at the present time.
