Dear Ben:

Thank you for your recent correspondence. I have called a couple of times and missed you so thought I should write you this letter.

First of all, I am sorry to hear of the sudden illness of Dr. Pauncz. I have always realized that the clinics at Northwestern received some voluntary help and I am sure it has always been appreciated by all concerned. I can well understand that the services of Dr. Maniscalco, Dr. Klotz, and Dr. Pauncz will now be greatly missed.

At the time of my last conversation with you it was my understanding that the psychiatrist whom you had in mind was ready to start work at once. From your letter of the 28th I take it that Dr. Roth can not start to work until July 1st. It all means, of course, that we will continue to lose funds which would otherwise be available during the next three months. In view of this fact I should like to ask if it would be possible to have Dr. Roth to begin his services now on an hourly basis and perhaps some of the plans of reorganization might be developed during this period.

Secondly, do you know of a social worker that we could add to the program in the immediate future so that we will not continue to lapse funds which will make it harder for appropriations at the next sessions of the general assembly? Meanwhile I will continue to inquire for a social worker or a psychologist whom we would send to you for approval.

We appreciate your statement in which you said you would talk to your staff to see if they can stay within the budget of \$2,000.00 a month for the next sixteen months.
