I'm sorry that I've been delayed so long in answering your letter but I've been all knocked out and have done practically nothing for the last three weeks, trying to get a much needed rest. I am, however, feeling a great deal better now.

I'm very happy to have the information on your early experiences with gastroscopy. Do not feel badly if you were not able to diagnose gastroscopically an infiltrating carcinoma. That in my opinion is one of the big problems for the future of gastroscopy. I do not know of anyone who gives courses in the use of the Tomenius biopsy gastroscope. However, it is very simple and as far as I'm concerned it is probably one of the best on the market at the present time. You may not need special instructions, you can probably develop a pretty good technique on your own. I would suggest, however, that you write to Mr. Bicknell of the Metro-Tec Company, 154 E. Erie Street, Chicago, Illinois. They can build in the Tomenius attachment on to your Gastroscope or they will sell you one with the attachment already built in. If you will ask Mr. Bicknell for detailed instructions in the use of the instrument I think he could tell you enough to get started by correspondence.

Thank you very much for your kind statement regarding the gastroscopy course. I saw or. Kelly briefly in Colorado Springs. I saw Dr. Siegel only from a distance. Please give them both my sincerest regards.
