Dear Dr. Goel:

We have your letter of June 11, 1974. At the Cook County Graduate School, we have been giving a two weeks concentrated course in upper gastrointestinal endoscopy for 25 years. At the present time, because of the increasing demand for training in this field, and because we can only accommodate four students at a time for two weeks ~~and~~ four different periods during the year, our placement training is quite limited.

However, your situation ^(where) seems to fit that which we feel merits special consideration. I have reference to the fact that you are practicing away from a big medical center ~~where~~ there is no gastroenterologist and no local opportunities for training in the endoscopic field.

We do feel that one of the purposes of the Cook County Graduate School is to help in the distribution of advanced and more modern techniques to people away from the biggest centers, so that these people may receive the benefits of these advances at an earlier period than they would otherwise be available.

I have spoken to the Dean, Mr. Eugene Meyers and I suggest that you write to him directly at 707 So. Wood Street, Chicago, Illinois 60612, giving him the essentials of your advanced training and experience, the names of the institutions where you received training, year of graduation size of your hospital, etc.
