Dear Colleague:

I am organizing a 50 minute workshop on "Gastrocamera Photography" which will be part of the Annual Meeting of the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy to be held on May 24, 1967 at Colorado Springs. The workshop will begin with a short presentation of the technique of photography with the GT-5A gastrocamera because many of the films to be included in the presentation will have been taken with this camera by this technique. The remainder of the period will be devoted to gastrocamera film interpretation with emphasis given to the diagnosis of early cancer and to the differentiation of benign from malignant ulcers. A few cases of unusual lesions will complete the program.


I would like to invite you to submit gastrocamera films to me which you think would be suitable for such a presentation. The films may have been taken by either a gastrocamera or a gastrocamera fiberscope. All films should show clear photographs of the lesion to be demonstrated. Films should provide a clue, which properly interpreted, will lead the viewer to make a correct diagnosis. We plan to project the films blindly. After the audience has had time to make their diagnosis, we will then project a transparency of the frame of greatest interest plus a sketch of the pathology of the lesion. At this point the individual who submitted the film will be asked for his comments if he is attending the meeting.

Since we wish to make enlargements and drawings of each film, we would appreciate receiving your films as soon as possible.
