The public is still enthused and there is a definite desire for your return. One of the sisters from the hospital and I had a long talk over the event. We both have hopes that the visit may become "the little mustard seed" spoken of in the Gospel.

It seems incongruous that I should have to mail this bill to you, since you were doing us the favor. Please note the deduction because of returns. In sending a note of appreciation to the Chicago Ministerial Alliance, the Black Medics etc etc, would it be in keeping to send them to your address? If not please send us the proper one
