Dear Doctor Berry:

I have tried a number of times to talk with you on the telephone, but you are harder to find than I am.

I read your memorandum to Rev. Koen of August 12 and since then I have talked with Sister Joanne Marie. I must say that I am still confused over how any sound program with follow-up can occur in Cairo if it depends upon people who are so far away. I am also mildly suspicious of putting very much dependence upon medical students in such an explosive situation.

I wish that you and I could spend a half-hour sometime discussing this in more detail. We have an important and serious situation down there and how to resolve it so that it is good for the people that really need care is not yet clear to me.

I am leaving this afternoon for Portugal for a couple of weeks. Is it possible that we can sit down sometime after the first of October and discuss the whole Cairo situation in depth?
