Postdoctoral fellowships are available to recent doctoral graduates (PhD, MD, or equivalent). Participants gain experience toward becoming independent researchers.

Graduate Students

The Graduate Partnerships Program brings PhD students to NIH for their dissertation research. Participants join the community of over 400 graduate students at NIH.

College Graduates

Postbaccalaureate fellowships are available to recent graduates (BS/BA or MS/MA). Participants gain up to two years of additional research experience before graduate school.

Undergraduate and High School Students

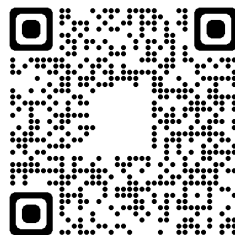
The Academic Internship Program provides research opportunities to high school and college students. Participants gain research experience while finishing their degree.
