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
Instructions for Retrieving NLM Publications in

Some delays due to the Government shutdown:

- The January-February and March-April 1996 issues of the *Technical Bulletin* will be combined as one issue, and we regret the delay of the November-December 1995 issue.
- Regular ELHILL database update schedules have been delayed for some files (AIDSLINE, SPACELINE, and HISTLINE); the AIDSLINE 1996 file is expected to be available in early February. Watch the online NEWS for details.
- Contract activities necessary to provide extended access to the MEDLARS Service Desk were delayed. Consequently, the hours of the Service Desk have been temporarily reduced to 8:30 am to 5:00 pm ET, Monday - Friday. Beginning March 25, 1996 evening and Saturday hours are expected to resume.
- The PC/DOS and Macintosh Grateful Med updates for 1996 and Grateful Med for Windows® have been delayed. Watch for announcements in the online NEWS, Technical Bulletin and Gratefully Yours.
- Oct-Dec 1995 quarterly invoices have been delayed.

HEALTH and HSTAR to Form One Database

In 1996, the Health Planning and Administration (HEALTH) and the Health Services/Technology Assessment Research (HSTAR) databases will be merged into one database, Health STAR (Health Services, Technology, Administration, and Research). HEALTH began in 1977 as a cooperative venture between the National Library of Medicine and the American Hospital Association

Technical Notes

New Clinical Alert Available

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) issued a Clinical Alert entitled "Adjuvant Therapy of Breast Cancer - Tamoxifen Update" on November 30, 1995. The NCI wants to bring new information regarding the optimal duration of adjuvant tamoxifen therapy to the attention of clinicians. New data suggest that more than five years of adjuvant treatment is not warranted in routine clinical practice in this patient population. The full text of this clinical trial alert is available via several NCI services (fax, e-mail, World-Wide Web and PDQ services) and also available to MEDLARS users from the ALERT file. To obtain the Alert by fax. use NCI's CancerFax by calling 301-402-5874 from a fax machine telephone. Follow the voice prompts, enter code 40012 when asked. To receive by e-mail, use NCI's CancerNet by sending an Internet e-mail message cancernet@icic.nci.nih.gov and look for late-breaking information. Health professionals may also contact the PDQ Search Service at 800-345-3300. The general public may contact the Cancer Information Service at 800-422-6237 to have information from PDQ sent to them.

NLM began offering Clinical Alerts online in January 1991. As noted in previous issues of the Technical Bulletin. National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Alerts were begun to expedite the release of findings from clinical trials funded by the NIH when the information might significantly affect morbidity and mortality. To retrieve the new alert online, type file alert at the first USER: prompt to enter the file. Then, at the next USER: prompt, type: alert (tf) followed by prt 1 dl at the next USER: prompt to see the full text of the alert. (type prt 1 without the dl at the USER: prompt to see an abbreviated entry).

The full text of National Institutes of Health Clinical Alerts are also mailed to all libraries that are members of the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (800-338-7657) and are made available on the NLM Gopher and the NLM anonymous ftp server. To obtain the latest NCI alert from the NLM Gopher, gopher to **gopher.nlm.nih.gov**, select the **National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Alerts**, then select the title given in the first sentence above. The advisory is also available in electronic form via anonymous ftp from the host **nlmpubs.nlm.nih.gov**, in the directory **alerts**, as **tamoxif.txt**.

ChemID Regeneration for 1996

The ChemID file has been regenerated and was made public on January 20, 1996. The file contains data for 287,404 substances. New data from all of its component sources has been added, and all Locator values have been updated. The Superlist component of the file now carries data from 33 federal, state and international lists. For the first time, the CC field of Superlist records contains descriptive data for the IARC, NTPT, RQ, TLV, S110, and S302 sources. This data is both searchable and printable. For a full description of the new Superlist sources, use the following search statement:

(no)list and description

You should retrieve 33 records which then may be printed in full.

E-Mail Address Addition to the MEDLINE Address (AD) Field

Effective in January 1996, an e-mail address will be added to the Address (AD) field of a MEDLINE record (or a record in other files using this same data entry mechanism) as it appears in the journal for the first author. Please remember that any address information, including the e-mail address, is for the

author at the time the work/article was done, and it is not necessarily the reprint source.

CHEMLINE, TOXLIT Price Changes

Effective January 1, 1996, the pricing structures of CHEMLINE, TOXLIT and TOXLIT65 files were modified in response to changes in the 1996 royalty rates charged by CAS® (Chemical Abstracts Service). CAS is the supplier of proprietary data for these files.

To accommodate these changes, the NLM Online Pricing Algorithm has been updated for the Search Statement Charge component for CHEMLINE, TOXLIT and TOXLIT65. CAS still does not charge a royalty for the Connect Hour Charge, but has raised its Search Statement Charge royalties.

Please see Table I on the reverse side of Appendix A for the new NLM rates for the five components of the online algorithm for CHEMLINE, TOXLIT, and TOXLIT65. Please note, too, that the charge for each Automatic SDI search from TOXLINE) has also been modified as a result of changes in royalty charges. The NLM portion of all charges has not changed. The online SHOW COST display reflects these changes.

Revised NLM Pricing Schedule

An updated Pricing Schedule for Domestic & Non-U.S. Charges is included as Appendix B of this issue of the *Technical Bulletin*.

Changes to September-October *Technical Bulletin*

The following are changes to be made to the September-October 1995 *Technical Bulletin*:

The date of the First National Conference on Human Retroviruses and Related Infections was given as December 12-16, **1995** instead of **1993** on page 4 of the September-October Technical Note entitled "Meeting Abstracts Added to AIDSLINE".

The footnote on page 48E should refer to Subheading Pre-explosions and Place of Publication Pre-explosions in Appendixes F and G, not E and F. Users are also advised to become familiar with the new Pharmacologic Action Pre-explosion lists in the 1996 Annotated MeSH, beginning on page I-78 and Tree Structures, beginning on page I-154. \square

CAIM Ceases with 1994 Cumulation

NLM has announced that its *Cumulated Abridged Index Medicus* will cease effective with volume 25, the cumulation of the 1994 issues of the monthly *Abridged Index Medicus* (AIM). A cumulation of the 1995 issues will not be published.

The Abridged Index Medicus was initiated in 1970 to "afford rapid access to selected biomedical journal literature of immediate interest to the practicing physician." A subset of citations from approximately 119 English-language clinical journals was selected for AIM. Although today it is becoming increasingly difficult to select a core of journals that meets the needs of the practicing physician, this publication has been of value to the community over the years. In the past two decades over two thousand libraries, clinics, colleges, public libraries, and individuals, including libraries in the depository program, have subscribed to the monthly issues and the annual cumulations.

There are several reasons for discontinuing this publication. First, during the past 20 years, increasing numbers of subscribers have been accessing the MEDLINE database directly and therefore subscriptions are declining. Searching MEDLINE provides a much

more efficient way to identify citations relevant to one's information needs and is more cost effective for most users. For example, for the cost of the annual volume, a user could perform approximately 45 Grateful Med searches. And secondly, since there are many demands on scarce Federal dollars, the National Library of Medicine must make some difficult choices between continuing to support existing products and improving or developing new products to meet the needs expressed by health sciences librarians and health professionals.

NLM Associate Director for Library Operations, Lois Ann Colaianni, said recently, "I realize that some find this publication particularly useful, and I would be happy to explore alternative sources for this information with such individuals. Please contact me at 301-496-6921, loisann@nlm.nih.gov, or by mail."

This decision does not affect the unabridged *Cumulated Index Medicus* (CIM). [As we go to press, GPO has announced a price of \$423 (\$528.75 non-US) for the 17-volume CIM, Vol. 36, 1995, scheduled to appear in May 1996; the stock number is 617-052-00310-4.] Nor does it affect the monthly *Abridged Index Medicus* for 1996.

(AHA). HSTAR was begun in 1994 by NLM's National Information Center on Health Services Research and Health Care Technology (NICHSR). HealthSTAR will continue and expand upon the cooperative venture between AHA and NLM. This new, combined database will incorporate the subject scopes of both HEALTH and HSTAR by citing literature on health care administration, economics, planning, and policy, as well as health services research, clinical practice guidelines, and health care technology assessment.

HealthSTAR will include citations to articles, monographs, journal monographic series, technical and government reports, meeting abstracts, conference papers, book chapters, and newspaper articles. Initially, the database will contain over 2.43 million citations, including citations from MEDLINE and CATLINE, citations indexed by AHA, retrospective NHPIC (National Health Planning Information Center) citations, and citations indexed for NICHSR. Journal literature cited will be post-1975; CATLINE records will be from 1985 forward and there will be no limitations on language. Because of the extremely large number of citations and monthly updates that are expected to be over 17,000 citations, HealthSTAR will be divided into a current file and one backfile. The inclusion dates of these two divisions are yet to be determined. The database will be updated weekly, and will contain all of the data elements currently found in HSTAR records.

It is expected that HealthSTAR will be available on ELHILL in February 1996, maintained with 1996 MeSH and including two or three 1996 Entry Month (EM) updates. The HEALTH and HSTAR databases will continue to be searchable until HealthSTAR is available. However, they will not be maintained with 1996 MeSH and no 1996 entries will be added. NLM and AHA regret the delay of approximately two entry months in making HealthSTAR available. This delay is unavoidable due to the complexity of the task and the necessity to coordinate its implementation with other NLM processes, such as Year-End Processing for MEDLINE and the interaction with Grateful Med and Loansome Doc. With the debut of HealthSTAR, HEALTH and HSTAR will no longer exist as separate files.

Users with Automatic SDI Service against HEALTH and/or HSTAR should refer to the September-October 1995 issue of the Technical Bulletin. NLM will run Auto SDIs originally stored for either of these two files against the new HealthSTAR when it becomes available. Strategies should be revised by February 29, 1996. If similar searches are run against both of the existing files, one should be deleted (use PURGESEARCH command). Retain the one named with the beginning letter of 'H', as that will be the preferred naming convention for the new file. Refer to the revised Automatic SDI Service Request Form (Appendix C) for the print format options for the new file. Regular monthly processing of HealthSTAR Automatic SDIs is expected to resume in March on the weekend following the SDILINE update.

Upon announcement of availability, HealthSTAR may be accessed by requesting FILE HEALTH, FILE HSTAR, or FILE HEALTHSTAR (or backfile names) at the USER: prompt. Some of the details for the formation of HealthSTAR are still to be determined; watch for announcements in the ELHILL online NEWS, \$INFO command, and forthcoming issues of the *Technical Bulletin*. Access to HealthSTAR via the Grateful Med software will be provided by choosing either the HEALTH or HSTAR selection from the Search Other Databases menu.

The Hospital and Health Administration Index, formerly the Hospital Literature Index, will be derived from HealthSTAR and continue to be published by the American Hospital Association during 1996. NLM Moves to FTS2000 Exclusively, Phasing Out Telenet, TYMNET & CompuServe

Background

Non-Internet telecommunications access to NLM's databases will soon be provided exclusively by the FTS2000 network. Last year NLM introduced a regional schedule for modem users to switch over to NLM's new telecommunications provider, FTS2000, from the existing

networks. These value-added networks are Telenet (SprintNet), TYMNET and CompuServe. The new FTS2000 number, 800-525-0216, will replace all existing numbers for access to the NLM databases by the end of 1996. AT&T provides the FTS2000 service for NLM. Many searchers have already switched over to the new FTS2000 network. Some initial performance problems were experienced, but they have been corrected by AT&T.

Grateful Med

The software updates for Grateful Med, DOS Version 6.7 and Macintosh Version 2.3, to be mailed this winter, will include the changes necessary for FTS 2000 access

to TOXNET, as well as improved FTS2000 scripts for MEDLINE/ MEDLARS and PDQ. The updates will not alter the existing communications settings in the user's software. A current DOS or Mac Grateful Med user who is using dialup modem communications must install the update and then use the Setup option to select FTS2000 as their only communications service. New users of Grateful Med should also select FTS2000 as their only communications service. Librarians may wish to contact Grateful Med users in their institutions to assist them in making the necessary changes to Setup so they can continue to connect without disruption as the other networks are discontinued.

Schedule

The phase out schedule for NLM availability via value-added networks is:

This plan allows NLM to sever the U.S. connections to the current providers in a phased approach, with networks other than FTS available through August on a limited basis. NLM has no choice in this matter. The Government has mandated that NLM must switch to FTS2000 services for asynchronous, dial-up communications. If you have not already

switched over to the FTS2000 number, please make the change as soon as possible. For the convenience of non-Grateful Med searchers, we are reprinting the login script to be used with the FTS2000 number in Figure 1 on the following page. Immediately report any problems to the MEDLARS Service Desk at 800-638-8480, or via Internet e-mail:

mms@nlm.nih.gov, or by fax: 301-496-0822. International telecommunications are not affected--FTS2000 is only for users in the 50 states and U.S. territories. Similarly, Internet communications are unaffected.

Access to the MEDLARS Service Desk for Deaf and Hearing-Impaired Searchers

Several options are available for deaf and hearing-impaired searchers to request and receive assistance from the MEDLARS Service Desk:

• A new TDD (Telephone Device for the Deaf) phone number, **301-435-2388**, is now available for accessing the Service Desk.

- Staff will respond to requests for assistance via TDD during regular NLM work hours, i.e., Monday-Friday, 8:30 am 5 pm, Eastern Time.
- Faxes may be sent to **301-496-0822**. If the question is urgent, consider using TDD instead or relay service.
- Telephone relay service (where a telephone operator relays typed questions by translating these into voice questions to the Service Desk representative) may be used to interact with the MEDLARS Service Desk. Relay services are available in all states, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. A list of relay

numbers for all states is included as Appendix D. The toll-free number for the MEDLARS Service Desk is **1-800-638-8480**.

• The mms@nlm.nih.gov Internet e-mail address may be used for MEDLARS assistance. Questions are answered daily by staff. Please use the gmhelp@nlm.nih.gov address for Grateful Med-related questions.

NLM Policy for Core Level Cataloging of Audiovisuals: A Revision

As of October 1, 1995, NLM policy for core level cataloging of audiovisuals includes the contribution of name authority headings established for audiovisuals and computer software to the national authority file maintained under the auspices of the National Coordinated Cataloging (NACO) Program. With this change, our core level policy for audiovisuals conforms to the basic premise of the emerging national standards for core level bibliographic records presently under development by the Program for Cooperative Cataloging (PCC).

This statement represents a revision to the preliminary policy which specified NLM's decision not to contribute authority records to the national authority database in performing NLM core level cataloging of audiovisuals. For a full description of NLM's policy for core level cataloging of audiovisuals, refer to the article titled AVLINE Update on page 15 of the March-April 1995 *Technical Bulletin*.

NLM Online Training Program: May - July 1996 Schedule

The July-August 1995 *Technical Bulletin* announced the January through April schedule of online training classes. Due to the ongoing negotiations of the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM) online training contract, we have decided to announce the May through July 1996 training schedule prior to the contract award.

The May-July 1996 training schedule primarily consists of the 3-day Fundamentals of MEDLARS Searching training class. The 2-day specialized module covering the chemical and toxicological databases will only be offered at the National Library of Medicine (NLM) in Bethesda, Maryland. No other specialized modules will be offered.

Appendix E contains the May-July 1996 schedule and the registration form to use to apply for these classes. Send registrations for these classes to the MEDLARS Management Section (MMS) at the NLM.

The Fundamentals class is designed for new searchers, focusing on ELHILL commands, MEDLINE, and MeSH vocabulary. Fundamentals concentrates on command language searching and is not recommended for Grateful Med searchers. For training in the use of Grateful Med, contact your local medical library or the nearest NN/LM Regional Medical Library.

The Chemical/Toxicology/TOXNET specialized module includes instruction on ChemID, CHEMLINE, TOXLINE, TOXLIT, and the various TOXNET databases. It is strongly recommended that you have previous online search experience/training or prior knowledge of the ELHILL command language before attending this specialized module. No basic operations are covered and all material assumes search system familiarity.

All classes are offered at **NO CHARGE** at all locations.

How to Apply

Register using the form in Appendix E. Every attempt will be made to place training applicants in the class requested.

If a class is filled, the applicants will be registered for their second choice, and also automatically placed on a waiting list for their first choice. Approximately one month prior to the class, registrants will receive a packet with information on hotels, local site arrangements and the class agenda.

Keep the following points in mind when applying for these classes:

- It is necessary to have a MEDLARS User ID code in order to attend any of the classes.
- Please specify the class dates and sites on your form. Remember to list a second choice to expedite scheduling. Please use a separate form for each applicant.
- All classes are considered "tentative" pending sufficient enrollment one month before the class.


